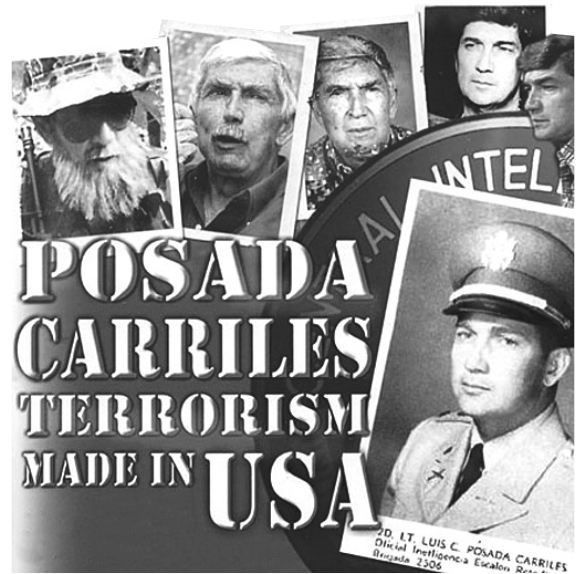

The Venezuelan documentary film “Posada Carriles: Made in USA” reveals the terrorist path of Luis Posada Carriles and his longstanding relationship with the CIA, dating back to the 1960’s. He was trained in the early 1960s by the CIA, at Ft. Benning GA, later known as the School of the Americas. Posada Carriles is an international terrorist who has sown death and destruction against Cuba and Latin American social movements.

The network of terror that the CIA established in Latin America—in which Posada Carriles acted as one of the key figures—is exposed in this gripping documentary, through the courageous testimonies of victims whose family members were killed by him or under his orders. It also includes the findings of anti-terrorist specialists and investigative journalists.

The demand for justice for the survivors and those who lost family members because of Posada Carriles’ actions comes to life on the screen to remind us all that terrorism cannot be justified under any circumstances. As said by George W. Bush himself, “Those that harbor terrorists, are also terrorists”.

In El Paso on Monday, March 1, Posada Carriles will be on trial for illegal entry into the United States in 2005, and for lying about his key role in the bombing of Havana hotels in 1997, in which one person was killed and many were injured. Although the U.S. government has refused so far to indict him for his more serious crimes—including the 1976 bombing of a Cuban airliner in which 73 people died—there will be much media attention on the trial.
