In 2001, the Cuban Five were condemned to a total of four life terms plus 77 years, after being railroaded by the U.S. government in its continued hostility toward Cuba and those who defend it.

A worldwide movement has arisen since the Five's unjust conviction. In the United States, the National Committee to Free the Cuban Five has waged an ongoing, vibrant campaign for their freedom.

The news in recent weeks has been filled with headlines in the U.S. press about "spy swaps" and "prisoner releases." Ten people were arrested in July by the FBI, accused Russian agents, and quickly sent back to Russia by Washington. They faced charges similar to the Cuban Five.

Former U.S. President Carter has traveled to North Korea to gain the release of one U.S. citizen, while New Mexico governor Bill Richardson has sought freedom for another in Cuba.

What about the Cuban Five who have been unjustly imprisoned for over 12 years now? This question needs to be posed publicly to President Obama and the United States government. We believe that the best way to do it is with a full-page ad in the Washington Post.

The Washington Post is the most prominent newspaper in the nation's capital. The Post is read daily by everyone in the U.S. political establishment and all international media outlets.
